Dear New Friends of Mine:

At the congregation I served in North Huntington, a 9-year-old misspoke the truth when she recited John 3:16 during the closing program of VBS. Trying so very hard to impress her parents, she spoke directly into the microphone and recited as clearly as she could:

For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have internal life.

At first, there was some chuckling from the adults. And then a collective "ahhh" was heard affirming the truth she spoke. "may not perish but may have internal life." How right she was. That's what we all want. That precious night is coming soon when we will know once again where "internal" JOY is to be found.

In the New Testament Greek, there are three-word groups translated as JOY.

- + The first-word group speaks of the festive internal joy that results in singing, dancing, clapping of hands, and the lifting up of praise to God in worship.
- + The second-word group identifies joy as the outward expression of an inner feeling of merriment. This is the joy of eating and drinking and enjoying the festive company and revelry of good friends. Jesus says this is an image of the joy of the eternal banquet of heaven.
- + But it is the third-word group that is the more commonly used in the New Testament. One hundred- and forty times Paul writes that it is this inner joy that is the hallmark of our life in Christ.

Paul explains that this JOY is not dependent on health or wealth, but entirely on God.

As Advent moves along, we will once again hear Paul's familiar refrain: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say Rejoice." (Philippians 4:4) On the 3rd Sunday in Advent, when a pinkish candle is lit, instead of a blue one, we will sing "Rejoice, Rejoice Believers!"

When Paul writes of REJOICING, he is describing a joy that was more than a mood or even an emotion. For Paul, JOY is a way of looking at the world - it is a perception of the presence of God that generates hope and endurance in affliction and temptation, because joy enables us to see beyond a particular event, whether good or bad, to see the sovereign Lord who stands above all and, ultimately, has control over all.

So, Paul does not say to rejoice in all circumstances. Paul says, "Rejoice in the Lord."

And since God never changes, Paul can say, "Rejoice in the Lord always." JOY that lasts is not externally dependent. It is not dependent on the absence of pain or sorrow. Joy that lasts is rooted and grounded in one thing – in the God who is eternal.

BLANKET SUNDAY/LWR COLLECTION PROJECT FINAL REPORT

Late summer we let you know that WGMC (Women's Group of Mt. Calvary) had been asked by the Allegheny Synod to take charge of the Blanket Sunday/Lutheran World Relief Collection Project. This turned out to be a larger undertaking than we had originally realized. It involved coordinating efforts from the congregations of the 6 Synod conferences (of which our Johnstown Conference is one); working with 2 trucking companies (McQuaide's and WARD); and setting a final date and time for all the donations to be delivered to one place. Finally, those donations of hundreds of boxes were loaded onto a tractor trailer and eventually trucked to the LWR Distribution Center in New Windsor, MD. We worked diligently and made it happen.

On November 4, five ladies from Mt. Calvary (Linda Barnhart, Karen Giunta, Kathy Ling, Gloria Reed, and Shirley Glova) drove to Newry Lutheran Church (Blair/Huntington Conference) to oversee the collection. God blessed us with excellent weather, safe travels, a congenial truck driver who arrived on time, AND (very importantly) Shirley's son, Mark, who arrived with a forklift and pallets and shrink wrap! The collection was to run from 10am to noon, but everything was loaded into the truck trailer and ready to go by 11:15! The delivery people from the various congregations greeted each other and then helped load pallets. It was an amazing cooperative effort! AND our hostess at Newry Lutheran had coffee and cookies for us!

So just how many items were loaded? In addition to the \$455 given to the Synod to purchase 91 blankets, the following items were donated by Allegheny Synod:

Blankets - 178
Baby Care Kits - 2
Quilts - 872
Fabric Kits - 25
Personal Care Kits - 1039
School Kits - 720

It was so heartwarming to know that people here in the US and around the world who face unimaginable hardships would have some help coming from Lutherans in the Allegheny Synod! Thank you for your help. It took a Synod!

Starting this January, the **Altar Guild** will be under the new direction of the Worship and Music Committee. I now have other responsibilities within our church community and my commitment to travelling between Virginia and Johnstown to take care of family is sometimes at a moment's notice. I appreciate the committee taking on this additional task and bringing new ideas and suggestions to the Altar Guild. What is Altar Guild? Altar Guild is a group of individuals who prepare the altar for worship each week.

How is that done? Members of the Altar Guild place the linens and sacraments (host/bread and wine) on the altar.

What other responsibilities go with this committee? The Altar Guild is responsible for cleaning up the altar and the altar area after each service. They will often walk through the sanctuary and collect any remaining bulletins, and when needed, they will launder altar linens.

Do I have to do this every week? Typically, several people are put on teams. Teams are assigned for a month or two depending on your availability and the number of volunteers. Members of each monthly team will be responsible for all the weekends in that month. Sounds like a lot, but it only takes 10-15 minutes of your time each weekend you are assigned. It's a very special way to help your church family.

What if I am unavailable for a particular weekend in my month? That is the beauty of having several people on the team. Team members work together so the burden does not fall on one individual! Teams will work together to ensure that the work gets done without putting too much of a burden on any one individual. Many hands make light the work!
