The Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA), our Lutheran denominations governing body, is preparing for the Churchwide Assembly meeting which is held every 3 years. At the 2022 Assembly there was a vote to study church structure and a Commission For A Renewed Lutheran Church was established. This commission will report at the upcoming 2025 meeting. The ELCA will be voting on items at this 2025 Churchwide Assembly that will impact Lutheran churches at the local level. All ELCA Lutheran churches have begun (if they are aware of the implications) to research and hold congregational meetings/informational sessions to make educated informed decisions that are for the good of their congregation.

This is NOT unique to Mt. Calvary.

It is time for us as a congregation to come together under God's guidance, to make the decision which is best to protect this church, it's history and our values and beliefs.

There will be upcoming church informational sessions for you to be able to attend. The dates for these *initial* meetings are the following:

January 31 @ 3:00pm

February 1 @ 6:30pm

February 2 @ 9:30am

These meetings are designed to provide you with researched information from reputable sources, an opportunity to do your own research, and an opportunity to come together as a congregation to ask questions in a respectful manner and pray together for our congregational future. There will be more dates to follow.

Funeral dinner update:

For a long time, we have had a wonderful, hard-working group of ladies volunteer their time to cook and serve funeral dinners when needed at Mt. Calvary. In recent years, some of these dinners consisted of approximately 100 people or more at one seating. These ladies have developed an excellent system and have always worked well together!

However, as the years have passed, age and health related issues have finally caught up with some members of the group. After much thought, consideration and discussion regarding alternatives, this group of amazing ladies has decided to discontinue offering funeral dinners. This decision was not arrived at easily. This group of ladies have taken pride in representing Mt. Calvary by putting on these dinners for families at a time when many forms of comfort are greatly appreciated.

That doesn't mean that the facilities at Mt. Calvary will no longer be available for funeral dinners or other events going forward. You are welcome to use Sander Hall or the gym for your dinner. However, going forward, you will just be required to enlist the services of an outside caterer to provide your choice of meals for your dinner or event.

If there is anyone that would like to volunteer to take up this task of continuing to provide these dinners for funerals, please contact any council member or Todd in the church office.

Thank you again ladies for all you have done throughout the years! Your efforts and dedication to Mt. Calvary throughout these past years will never be forgotten. And may Our Lord continue to bless you!!!!

Happy February from the Call Committee:

For those of you that attended the brief congregational meeting on Sunday January 26th, allow this month's note to follow up on some of the questions and concerns that were raised during our pre-meeting discussions. For those of you who were unable to attend, this note will serve as an update to the status of the call committee and hopefully answer any questions you may have.

First and foremost, let me assure you that the Call Committee still exists and is eagerly waiting for potential candidates to be identified. Early in the process, the bishop informed the council and call committee that locating a new pastor could take two years or more. We were advised that over 30 vacancies existed within the Synod and nearly 600 vacancies existed nationwide. Let us assure you that the Call Committee's desire is to identify a Lutheran Minister as our next leader.

One of the questions which arose on Sunday was the possibility of sharing a pastor with another congregation. While this may be a possibility, that decision falls to the Church Council not the Call Committee.


Another question surrounded who was on the Call Committee and why they were not presented to the congregation. The answer is that during the council meeting where the Call Committee was appointed, a vote was held and a majority elected to remain anonymous until such time as a potential candidate was identified. Considering how quickly words travel within the congregation, it is surprising that two years later the members of the committee are still unknown to most. In order to be as transparent as possible, I have reached out to the other members of the committee and ask that I be allowed to share their identities with the congregation.

You may recall from earlier communications that our church council retained the services of The Shepherds Staff, a recruiting firm specializing in assisting congregations desiring to locate new pastors. Six months of aggressive recruitment and interviewing by The Shepherds Staff only resulted in a single qualified candidate who ultimately elected to remain at the church he was serving at the time. With the limited results and a less than optimistic outlook, church council and The Shepherds Staff reached an agreement to suspend the search while council considers the best options for the church moving into the future.

In June of this year, the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was updated to reflect changes in the leadership at Mt Calvary and on the call committee. The MSP is a document that is shared across all synods within the ELCA allowing access to pastors seeking a new call to review all current openings. The MSP includes information related to the local community, the church, compensation and benefits packages, and the pastor's qualifications requirements.

As we move into 2025 with a new Bishop and new direction from the congregation, we are praying for a timely and successful conclusion to our search. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me with any questions or concerns. I look forward to seeing you at the rescheduled congregational meeting on February 9th.

FINAL UPDATE **BLANKET SUNDAY** 2024

When we last reported on Blanket Sunday donations, many congregations had not yet submitted their final monetary amount given to purchase blankets for Lutheran World Relief. With the end of the year, we believe the last of the monies has arrived in the Synod Office. Final tally for 2024 was \$5807.80. That amount of money will allow Lutheran World Relief to purchase over 1100 blankets to help with disaster relief, both nationally and internationally.
