Introduction to the Festival of the Reformation

While it's tempting on Reformation Sunday to focus on Luther's theology, Luther was primarily concerned with faith and not theological musings. Theologian and author Frederick Buechner talks about the distinction between the two this way: "Theology is reasoned, systematic, and orderly whereas faith is disorderly, intermittent, and full of surprises." I see some of you nodding your heads – good!

To Buechner, Faith is not about ascribing to this doctrine or that practice, Faith is about the stirring of the Spirit within – "our movement *toward the divine*." Buechner's description is an apt one and perhaps particularly encouraging for those of us who embrace the challenge of belonging to a continually reforming tradition such as ours.



Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The renewed covenant will not be breakable, but like the old covenant it will expect the people to live upright lives. To know the Lord means that one will defend the cause of the poor and needy (Jer. 22:16). The renewed covenant is possible only because the Lord will forgive iniquity and not remember sin. Our hope lies in a God who forgets.

³¹The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord.

³³But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

³⁴No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Psalm 46

God is our shelter and strength, a very present help in times of trouble. Therefore, we will not be afraid, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the depths of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains totter as it heaves.

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

There is a river whose streams refresh the city of God, a river which makes glad the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be shaken; At the crack of dawn God helps her. The nations rage and the kingdoms shake; he raises his voice, the earth melts away.

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Come now, behold the works of the Lord; see what astounding things he has done in the world. Behold the One who puts an end to the futility of war, who breaks the bow, and snaps the spear; who piles the shields upon the flames. "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted over the earth."

Second Reading: Romans 3:19-28

Paul's words stand at the heart of the preaching of Martin Luther and other Reformation leaders. No human beings make themselves right with God through works of the law. We are brought into a right relationship with God through the divine activity centered in Christ's death. This act is a gift of grace that liberates us from sin and empowers our faith in Jesus Christ.


¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.








Preface
